- Consider replacing old windows with ENERGY STAR®-qualified windows, which can reduce heat gain in the summer. Some local utilities even offer rebates or other incentives for window replacement.
- If replacing a home's windows is not an option, consider installing white window shades, drapes or blinds to reflect heat away from the house.
- Close curtains on the south- and west-facing windows during the day.
- Install awnings on south- and west-facing windows to shade the house from the afternoon sun.
- On hot days when the air conditioner isn't running, consider venting double hung windows from the top to allow the hottest air near the ceiling to vent to the outside first.

Earthwise Windows & Doors meet the highest energy standards in the industry, including those set by ENERGY STAR, the National Fenestration Rating Council (NFRC) and The American Architectural Manufacturing Association (AAMA).

The organization's windows and doors also carry the Made in USA Certified® seal.
